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achieved so far and what their future plans are concerning the stoppage by Canada Post of individual rural home delivery to 80 some residents on Highway 311 in North River.

The Committee is seeking Council's support in having this mail service re-instated to the citizens in the area. Mr. Marcotte indicated that the Committee has met with Karen Casey, MLA for Colchester North, to seek her support in their efforts. Bill Casey, MP for Cumberland/Colchester, has also been approached about a possible meeting. As well, the Committee has a petition which can be made available to Councillors to have their constituents sign if they so choose. The Committee is not expecting Councillors to go door to door with this petition but requested that it be placed in a public location in their district. An email address has also been established for those who wish to write in to show support.

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Staff Presentations**Existing Level of Fire Service**

Gary MacIsaac, Chief Administrative Officer and Kim Paterson, Administrative Assistant/Researcher provided a powerpoint presentation to Council on the outcome of an existing level of fire service questionnaire. This questionnaire came about following Council's long range planning discussions when the question arose on how increasing insurance costs were affecting the fire service. In the Fall of 2005, an eight member committee was formed to look at this and other issues affecting the fire service. The first task of the committee was to develop a questionnaire in order to provide a better understanding of the current fire service and present this information to Council.

The committee surveyed 16 of the 17 brigades which receive money from the County for fire protection, the exception being Shubenacadie. There was no financial information gathered from either Bible Hill or Stewiacke and all other financial data is either from 2004 or 2005.

The purpose of this exercise was to establish a baseline level of fire service amongst the brigades. The second purpose was to brief Council on the situation as it currently exists. The committee hopes to meet again in August or September and return to Council in the Fall of 2006 with recommendations before the budget cycle for 2007-08 begins.

Deputy Mayor Matheson reported on recent meetings of Regional Chairs and the Northern Region Waste Management Committee. Diversion credits in the amount of \$438,000 will be split amongst East Hants, Colchester and Cumberland as well as \$100,000 for the 10-year celebration of the Colchester Waste/Resource Management site being in operation.

Councillor Cooke reported on two meetings he had attended of the Library Board, one on May 30 at which time, Mayor Dereck Rhoddy made a presentation on behalf of the Stewiacke School Enhancement Committee regarding the library being part of the new elementary school in the town of Stewiacke. The second meeting held on June 27th had in attendance the Director of Provincial Libraries, Jennifer Evans, who spoke on the pros and cons of libraries being built in schools.

Councillor White reported on CoRDA's annual general meeting. A roast was held for Ron Creighton who is retiring as Chair of the Board after 14 years.

Councillor Masters reported that Millbrook has put a representative on the CoRDA Board for the first time.

Update**

Construction is well underway on the remaining section of the Cobequid Trail in Old Barns. Work is expected to be completed within the next two weeks. The Municipality is having an opening ceremony to coincide with the annual Old Barns summer celebrations on Sunday, August 6th at 11:30 a.m. at the start of the trail at the Old Barns Church.
